Academic Overview

All classes at OHS are geared toward preparation for learning beyond high school. It is clear that in today's job market, young men and women will have to continue their learning beyond high school, no matter which path they take.

Core academic offerings include Art, Agriscience and Natural Resources, Business & Marketing, English, Health & Phy Ed, Math, Performing Arts, Science, Social Studies, Technology & Engineering, and World Languages.

All OHS students receive a Chromebook for educational use at school and home. This gives our students opportunities to enhance and extend their learning through digital resources. Teachers maximize this technology resource to enrich student learning opportunities through a variety of online tools.

EXCEPTIONAL ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

OHS is one of only two high schools in the state of Wisconsin to offer both Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) classes to all students. We are the only public high school in Waukesha County to offer the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma program and IB courses. We have experienced strong growth in both of these programs as families seek rigorous, world-class high school curriculum for their students.

Since 2002, Oconomowoc High School has realized significant growth in AP class and in the number of students taking AP exams, as evidenced by the charts at right. OHS offers 12 AP classes and 15 IB courses, with more students participating each year.

PROJECT LEAD THE WAY

In 2005, we added the Project Lead
The Way curriculum to our technology


education curriculum. In 2012, we were granted the IB-PLTW Career Programme (IBCP). This course of study allows students to experience a specially designed PLTW core while recognizing IB values and the needs of pre-engineering students. IBCP allows students the rigor of the IB program, while focusing on STEM (science, technology, engineering and math). As a sidelight to the engineering offerings, we have developed an internationally competitive and award winning robotics program at the high school and intermediate schools.

The largest change over the past decade at OHS is technology. As a leader in the instructional use of technology, we have integrated the use of technology as a vehicle for communication, teaching, researching and creating. All students receive a Chromebook for academic use at school and home. Teachers are able

to share information with students through a variety of online tools to better facilitate the teaching and learning process. In 2011, we integrated one of the first Game Design courses at the high school level in the State, attracting students with a wide variety of career and personal interests.

AP Classes and Exams

Advanced Placement® (AP) courses are college-level courses offered in high school. They



give students a taste of what college is like and can help them stand out on college applications. Scoring well on the AP® Exam can earn a student college credit, placement out of introductory courses or both, potentially saving thousands of dollars in tuition and fees.

A variety of AP classes are offered to OHS students including English Literature, Psychology, History, and Calculus, among others. AP Exams are administered each spring and represent the culmination of college-level work in a secondary school setting. Exams are scored on a 5-point scale. Success on an AP Exam is defined as an exam score of 3 or better, which represents the score point predictive of college success and college graduation.



International Baccalaureate (IB)

Oconomowoc High School is proud to offer the International Baccalaureate (IB) Organization's Diploma Programme. This outstanding pre-university course of study is designed for highly motivated students in 11th and 12th grades.

It is a comprehensive two-year curriculum, designed for students seeking a challenging and rigorous educational experience with a unique international, cross-curricular focus and exceptionally high standards for achievement. The IB program is designed to provide students with a balanced education through comprehensive studies of languages, sciences, mathematics, humanities, and community involvement.

IB-PLTW Career Programme

OHS also offers the IB-PLTW Career Programme (IBCP, formerly IBCC). This course of study allows students to experience a specially designed PLTW

core while recognizing IB values and the needs of pre-engineering students. While some of the PLTW courses may be completed during grades nine and ten, the IBCP is only available to 11th and 12th grade students.

IB Coursework

Students may opt to take individual IB courses and receive scores for the courses and examinations they successfully complete, or they can enroll in the full IB Diploma Programme, or IB-PLTW Career Programme. Most colleges award credit for successful completion of HL courses, and some colleges award credit for both HL and SL courses. Oconomowoc High School offers the following IB courses:

Facilities

The main construction projects for Athletic Fields Forever were completed when Rux Stadium opened for the first home game in August 2014. The AFF project has solidified the future of Oconomowoc athletics and re-energized pride in our students, coaches, teachers, parents and overall community. All outdoor facilities for football, soccer, tennis, track, baseball and softball were improved and renovated. OHS Athletics is proud to be a leader in our school community as well as the larger picture of the general community.

Other key facilities help us meet the needs of all athletes:

- Ten competitive tennis courts and pavilion
- The Oconomowoc High School Field House, which features seating for 2,000 spectators of basketball, volleyball and other indoor sports within 35,000 square feet of gym space.
- The Personal Development Center (PDC) weight training and conditioning center

The Oconomowoc Arts Center (OAC) is a first-class professional facility built to celebrate the arts, created for the students of the Oconomowoc Area School District and the greater Lake Country area. The OAC officially opened to the public in December 2008. The mission of the OAC is to provide the highest quality arts programming to the Oconomowoc Area School District and the community for the purpose of cultural education, entertainment and enrichment.



Oconomowoc High School's Performing Arts Department provides students many opportunities to develop an aesthetic awareness and sensitivity to themselves, others, and to the world around them through the process of collaborative creation. Students will find many ways to explore the world of drama in our theater program. Graduates will have the necessary training and skills to continue their studies at any professional training program in the country. OHS has a talented staff of educators who bring our programs to fruition. Ultimately, our program goal is to enhance the quality of life during the school years through participation in the performing arts and help students become life-long supporter of the arts.




- Grilling to Give facilitated by the OHS Marketing and DECA students, this annual event donates all proceeds to a local charity
